SUBJECT: 2018 Landscape Renovation Project Update

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the completion of the irrigation retro-fit and turf reduction project in cul-de-sacs (CDS) 14 and 15 for 2019.

BACKGROUND

At the June 14, 2018, meeting of the Landscape Committee, CDS 14 and 15 were approved by the committee as the location for the Renovation Project.

The project areas included approximately 126,000 total square feet of landscape with approximately 18,000 square feet of turf along the serpentine walk to remain. These locations were identified as areas that would benefit by upgrading the irrigation systems, reducing turf, and performing minor re-landscaping.

DISCUSSION

The Irrigation Team began work in November 2018, at CDS 14; Building 492 and ended the year at Building 482 (Attachment 2).

The following is a summary of the work that was performed at Buildings 487-492 and 480-484:

- Areas of turf and shrub beds irrigated by the same valve were separated.
- Areas of shrub bed and slope irrigated by the same valve were separated.
- Sprinkler head spacing was corrected to increase the uniformity of water distribution.
- Turf sprinkler nozzles were changed to higher efficiency, low precipitation rotary nozzles.
- Shrub beds which received irrigation repairs were converted to drip irrigation.

Staff will need to complete the reseeding of the turf and plant replacement due to the irrigation improvements (Attachment 1).

The following is a summary of the work to be performed in these areas:

- Lawn areas that are performing poorly due to competition with trees or other factors will be converted to shrubs or groundcover;
- Lawn areas that are difficult or inefficient to mow will be converted to shrubs or groundcover (with resident input).
- Poorly performing shrub bed and slope plantings will be replaced.

Staff recommends continuing this project in 2019; work would continue in CDS 14 (Buildings 480-492) and continue down the serpentine walk to the front of Building 485. The work will progress in the following order; Buildings 476-477, 472-475 and 471-472, and finish in CDS 15 at Building 467.

Approximately 42,000 square feet was upgraded with new irrigation at a cost of \$64,840. The estimated remaining costs for each of the project segments are presented in the table below:

Staff estimates the completion of this project to be \$185,146. The 2019 Business Plan includes \$350,000 in reserve expenditures for landscape renovation identified for this purpose.





Attachment 2: Map of Project Location


ATTACHMENT 1 CDS 14 Irrigation Areas

SUBJECT: Request for Tree Removal: 612-C (Henderson) – White Mulberry tree

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the request for the removal of a White Mulberry tree located at 612-C and plant a replacement tree at Mr. Henderson's expense.

BACKGROUND

Mr. Henderson purchased the unit in May 2016, and is requesting the removal of a White Mulberry tree, *Morus*, *alba*, located at the rear of the unit in the lawn area (Attachment 1). The reasons cited by him for the removal are; litter/debris, overgrown, and potential slip and fall from wet leaves. Five additional residents have signed the form in favor of the removal and one resident is against (Attachment 2).

The tree was last trimmed in January 2016, and is scheduled for review this fiscal year. The tree is approximately 32 feet in height with a trunk diameter of approximately 19 inches and is growing approximately 6 feet from the walkway and approximately 14 feet from the patio and is encroaching on the Indian Laurel Fig, *Ficus microcarpa 'Nitida'* located at Building 613.

DISCUSSION

At the time of inspection, the tree was found to be in fair condition with visible signs of decay, noticeable surface rooting, and a slight lean with a correcting balanced canopy. Currently, there is cracking in the sidewalk with previous concrete grinding and a portion of the concrete walkway was replaced to address potential root caused issues. Additionally, there have been 25 requests to pick up leaves over the last 10 years.

Based upon Resolution 01-13-17, the tree may be removed due to visible signs of decay and interference with a neighboring tree. Absent this resident request, this tree would be added to the trimming schedule for fiscal year 2019. Mr. Henderson has offered to have the tree removed at his cost.

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

Based on tree inventory data, the estimated value is \$3,290. The estimated cost to trim is \$300. The cost to remove the tree is estimated at \$900 and the cost of planting a replacement tree is estimated at \$100.



SUBJECT: Request for Tree Removal: 598-D (Yan) – Canary Island Pine tree located at

598-D

RECOMMENDATION

Deny the request for the removal of a Canary Island Pine tree located at 598-D and maintain trim schedule.

BACKGROUND

Mr. Yan purchased the unit in August 2018, and is requesting the removal of a Canary Island Pine tree, *Pinus*, *canariensis*, which is located in the shrub bed area at the front of the unit (Attachment 1). The reasons he has cited for the removal are; litter and debris, structural damage, sewer damage, overgrown, poor condition, and the tree is leaning toward the unit. Three additional residents have signed in favor of the removal (Attachment 2).

The tree was last trimmed in December 2015, and is currently scheduled for review this fiscal year. The tree is approximately 60 feet in height with a trunk diameter of approximately 20 inches and is growing approximately 3 feet from the walkways and seat wall, approximately 9 feet from the irrigation backflow device, and approximately 7 feet from the unit.

DISCUSSION

At the time of inspection, the tree was found to be in good condition with no visible decay, pests, or trunk damage. There is minimal cracking in the sidewalk that does not appear to be caused by the tree. There is neither indication of structural damage to the unit nor a record of any mainline stoppages. There was discussion by the United Landscape Committee to select Pine tree removals when originally planted in grove-like scenarios, groups of 3, 5 or 7. This tree would not be eligible based on its single planting location.

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

The cost to remove the tree is estimated at \$1,600, cost to trim is estimated at \$400, and the estimated value is \$4,813, based on tree inventory data.



Dear Board Member,

I'm requesting that the pine tree located in the front flower bed be removed as soon as possible. This pine tree is located in the flower bed, too closed to the manor and has overgrown over the years without proper trimming. In the last six months, it has been shedding tremendous amount of brown pine needles everyday which covers the flower bed, the walk ways adjacent to the manor. Last week after the wind/rain storm, the brown needles were over the roof, gutters and the atrium and patio. The gutters are severely clogged by the pine needles that it could no longer hold water and drain through the down sprout. Further more, I noticed that the tree is leaning towards the manor after the storm. I wanted to inform you and have it in the record that the tree is in danger of falling and is now posing threat to the lives of the people in the manor as well as surrounding areas. The overgrown pine tree is in extremely poor condition. The pine needles are coming down in large amount everyday and are covering walk ways, gutters and causing structure damages as well as sewer damages. What is concerning is the fact that it is leaning and may fall if there is another storm like the one we had last week. I have neighbors knocking on my door urging me to inform the board of this pine tree problem. I have six neighbors volunteered to sign the request for removing the tree. Attached please find pictures of the tree.

The landscaping department has been coming to the manor every two weeks to clean the pine needles and they are also very concerned about the tree. Please see their comment on the request form. Landscaping had to remove all dead plants killed by pine needles and is in the process of planting new ones. Cleaning up the pine needles has put a lot of burden on the landscaping department.

I urge the board to approve removal of this pine tree as soon as possible before further damages can be done.

SUBJECT: Request for Tree Removal by – 599-E (Myhra) – 2 Canary Island Pine trees

located at 599-E

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the request for the removal of one of the Canary Island Pine trees located at 599-E.

BACKGROUND

Ms. Myhra purchased the unit in May 1988. She is requesting the removal of two Canary Island Pine trees, *Pinus, canariensis,* located at the side of the unit in the lawn area (Attachment 1). The reasons cited by her for the removal are; litter/debris, overgrown, structural damage, sewer damage, and seasonal pollen. Ms. Myhra previously requested the removals of these trees in December 2017. The United Landscape Committee toured the area and denied the request. Seven additional residents have signed in favor of the removal (Attachment 2).

The trees were last trimmed in December 2015, and are scheduled for inspection/trimming review this fiscal year. The trees are approximately 63 feet in height with a trunk diameter of approximately 22 inches and are growing approximately 3 feet from the walkways, approximately 9 feet from the unit, and approximately 7 feet apart.

DISCUSSION

At the time of inspection, the trees were found to be in good condition with no visible decay, pests, or trunk damage. There is surface rooting with some cracking in the sidewalk. There was no noticeable structural damage to the unit. There have been several single waste line stoppages reported, but no mainline stoppages, and no reports of roots being the cause.

The Landscape Committee has discussed Pine tree removals in scenarios in which they have been planted too closely and are in groves or groups of 3, 5, or 7. It was further discussed that the removal of a portion of the group would allow the remaining trees to fill out properly, reduce the amount of needle drops, and increase sunlight to the surrounding turf or shrub bed area.

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

The cost to remove one tree is estimated at \$1,600, cost to trim is estimated at \$400, and the estimated value is \$5,509, based on tree inventory data.


