1. Call to Order

Chair Walsh called the meeting to order at 1:30 P.M.

2. Acknowledgment of Media

Chair Walsh noted no members of the media were present.

3. Approval of the Agenda

The agenda was approved as written.

4. Approval of Meeting Report for March 7, 2018

The Meeting Report of March 7, 2018 was approved as written.

Chair Walsh asked Director Moldow for an update on the letter he wrote to SCE regarding Utility Tax Savings.

Chair Walsh stated that the updates needed in Stellar to allow for accurate reporting of Electric Vehicles and Golf Carts are a low priority for the Information Services Department at this time.

5. Chairman's Remarks

Chair Walsh remarked on the CPUC rate changes for residential and commercial customers, the definition of Time of Use, programmable dryers and the possibility of laundry facility charges.

6. Member Comments (Items Not on the Agenda)

There were no member comments.

7. Department Head Update

Ernesto Munoz provided an update on the proposed SCE project with PAR Electric in United, the Street Light Acquisition project and the RFP for the Walkway Lighting project in Gates 5 & 6.

The Electric Vehicle History Report was pulled from Consent for discussion. A motion was approved and unanimously carried to approve all items under the consent calendar.

Advisor Leonard commented on missing information from the EV Decal & History Reports.

Discussion ensued regarding parking issues, time of use costs, inadequate infrastructure, the need to collect vehicle identification numbers and accurate reporting as affected by incomplete data collected.

11. Golf Cart Report (carport & home charge)

Advisor Leonard and Director Skillman commented that certain electric golf carts were not listed on the report. The Security Department will start registering every golf cart in July.

Chair Walsh directed staff to leave these items on the agenda as a place holder and to not generate reports until the system for data mining can be corrected.

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Reports:

12. Lighting Survey Gates 7 & 8 (oral discussion)

Chair Walsh commented on the survey completed by US Energy. The lighting fixtures in Gates 5/6 are different from those in Gates 7/8. The majority of poles in Gates 7/8 belong to SCE.

Discussion ensued regarding using Siemen's to review the proposed fixtures for walkway lighting once the street light acquisition/LED conversion project is completed, possible replacement of the mushroom cap fixture and adding additional walkway lighting for the dark spots to the 5 year plan.

13. Prioritize Third Mutual Energy Projects for Energy Consultant (oral discussion)

Ernesto Munoz suggested that staff provide a list of priorities to the consultant and they can research and provide costs for budgeting purposes.

Discussion ensued about project priorities. Items to be added to the list are to evaluate photometrics of walkways, research solar powered irrigation/sprinklers, EV charging stations on streets and at Garden Villa buildings.

14. LED Walkway Lighting Approval for United Mutual (11/25/14)

Director Skillman summarized the report on the walkway light improvements that took place on United Mutual's portion of Gates 5/6 in 2014 and 2015. The fixtures are slightly different than the new bollards that are specified for Third Mutual's side of Gates 5/6.

Discussion ensued regarding rebates, LED bulbs, bollard type, dark spots, the lighting pilot near buildings 2354 and 2355, light dispersion, and any history of trips and falls.

15. Revised Energy Committee Charter

Discussion ensued regarding proposed names for the combined Energy Committee, community choice aggregation, city owned light poles, Corporation Bylaws and the possibility of changing from a Committee to a Taskforce.

By consensus, representatives from the three corporations will speak to their attorneys about their Bylaw rules for a joint Committee or Taskforce and bring back suggestions for a new Charter to a future Energy Committee meeting.

Street Lights: On 4/03/18 the contract with Siemens in the amount of \$843,857 was executed. The scope of work is to assist with the street light acquisition, retrofit of the existing lighting fixtures, and to perform the operations and maintenance of the asset for three years. A kick-off meeting with Siemens was conducted on April 24. Siemens is currently coordinating with SCE to have the acquisition agreement executed with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) scheduled in mid-June. The transfer process of surveying, tagging, and invoicing for the assets will be complete in November 2018. The pilot program to select the LED fixtures for the retrofit will start in September 2018. The LED retrofit of 688 street light fixtures will be completed in March 2019.	Walkway Lighting: Supergreen Solutions installed 6 pilot bollards in cul-de-sac 202. These bollards were viewed at night by several Directors and a member from staff. The Directors were pleased with the bollards and gave direction to move forward with an RFP for replacement of all fixtures with these bollards. Staff had a pre-bid meeting on April 26th with 4 contractors in attendance and viewed the site. Bid submission deadline is May 10th, after which staff will review the bids and present a recommendation for contract award at the June M&C meeting.
The Third Board allocated funding in 2018 towards the purchase of the Southern California Edison street light infrastructure. Additionally, funding will be allocated to offset the cost of consulting services to assist with the acquisition, and the upgrade of other exterior lighting. RESOLUTION 03-18-XXX

Third Laguna Hills Mutual Village Energy Committee Charter and Mission

NOW THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED, November 18, 2014 May 15, 2018, the Board of Directors of the Third Laguna Hills Mutual (hereafter, "Mutual") hereby assigns the duties and responsibilities of this Committee, as follows:

The Village Energy Committee will consist of three members of Third Mutual and two voting members each from United Mutual and GRF.

The mission of the Third Mutual Laguna Hills Village Energy Committee is to identify and recommend to the all Boards, investments in energy technologies which will address safety, economic, environmental and aesthetic issues of the Mutual, and its residents, GRF Facilities, and enhance the future property values.

- 1. Recommend to the Boards for their approval all actions that will result in energy savings for Mutual residents and an improved environment for the Community.
- 2. Review monthly mutual energy statements and other reports affecting the Corporations' energy usage. of this the Corporations. Review anomalous deviations and identify causes of the same and, where undesirable, recommend corrective action. Request development of tools by Staff to facilitate this action.
- 3. Work closely with Staff and review all devices or systems that either generate, control or consume electricity within <u>Mutualthe Corporations</u>. Identify alternatives that would be beneficial. to the <u>Mutual tTaking</u> into consideration factors such as efficiency, reliability, sustainability, installation, cost, return on investment, carbon foot print, human factors, and operability. Propose priorities of actions.
- 4. Seek out financial energy incentive programs applicable to the Mutuals and GRF Facilities.
- 5. Maintain communications with the other Laguna Woods corporate energy committees Maintenance and Construction Committees and exchange information pertinent to each committee.
- 6. Work with the Mutual's Communications Committee to make Mutual residents aware of actions they can take to reduce their own energy costs and aid the environment.
- 7. In conjunction with Staff, make monthly progress reports to the Mutual's <u>and GRF's M&C Committees</u> on investigation results, resident actions and comments and Committee-approved projects.
- 8. To avoid misunderstandings due to lack of familiarity with technology and products the Committee shall arrange seminars and invite speakers from vendors, universities, trade

- groups or consultants and establish a blog site to provide information and answer questions.
- 9. Suggest action the Board should take with respect to the California Public Utility Commission or legislature regarding proposed tariff charges or bills affecting the Mutual.
- 10. Work with the Mutual's residents and their installers to identify policy changes that can facilitate residents' actions to reduce energy costs.
- 11. Advise the Board of Directors regarding requests for proposals pertaining to energy considerations for review and possible modification by the Board before going to Purchasing.
- 12. Review the bidders list on energy-related proposals, review their qualifications, and advise the Board regarding the qualifications and completeness of energy-related proposals. The Committee will not contact bidders or potential bidders. once a bid request has been made, until bids have been received.
- 13. Identify the energy-related aspects of proposed Mutual projects, and alert and advise the Board to the energy impacts of such projects and make appropriate recommendations to the Mutual Board.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that Resolution 03-14-116133, adopted November 18 October 21, 2014 is hereby superseded and canceled.
