We are close to getting the ok from the County to clear preserve area with a fire break.

We have over 1,400 berry trees and some will be injected so they won't drop their berries. Mr. Wiemann will report more on that.

At the Third Board meeting, we approved the Tree Maintenance Policy which combines all policies about trees into one policy.

6. Department Head Update

Mr. Wiemann reported that he is excited about a pilot tree injection program on trees which drop seeds often referred to as "berries." It is a plant growth regulator which prevents the tree from dropping their berries. We will photograph the process and show the committee next month.

At Gate 10 and 11, we are trying to get approval for clearing 100 feet from the wall as a fire fuel reduction measure. It is county property out there and is under a nature conservancy which manages wildland throughout the state. Hopefully, we will perform this clearing in late June. The timing depends on a contract between the county and the nature conservancy.

SUBJECT: Tree Removal Request: 3422-E (Leung) – One Indian Laurel Fig tree

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the request for the removal of one Indian Laurel Fig tree.

BACKGROUND

Mr. Leung purchased the manor in November 2018, and is requesting the removal of one Indian Laurel Fig tree, *Ficus, microcarpa* 'Nitida' located at the side of the manor. The reason cited for the removal is the potential for structural damage. There are twelve additional signatures on the Mutual Request Form (Attachment 1).

The tree was last pruned in August 2020. Future trimming is tentatively scheduled for fiscal year 2022. The height of the tree is approximately 38 feet with a trunk diameter of approximately 29 inches. The tree is approximately seven feet from the sidewalk, six feet from the manor, and six feet from the air conditioning unit and electrical junction box (Attachment 2).

DISCUSSION

At the time of inspection, the tree was found to be in good condition with a well-balanced canopy.

There was no noticeable trunk damage with multiple surface rooting which is typical for this species. There is some damage to the larger surface roots due to lawn mowing operations. A number of surface roots are evident along the exterior wall of the manor, as well as under the electrical conduit. There was no noticeable infrastructure damage at this time.

There are two additional Ficus trees in close proximity to this one. One is approximately 15 feet to the right and one approximately 20 feet to the left. There isn't sufficient room between the trunk and the manor to safely perform a root trench. Given the surface rooting that is already at the manor's outer wall, it would only be a matter of time before structural damage would occur.

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

The cost to remove the tree is estimated at \$1,711, the cost to trim the tree is estimated at \$100, and estimated value of the tree is \$6,080 based on the tree inventory data.



SUBJECT: Tree Removal Request: 5509-C (Macke) – One Rusty Leaf Fig tree

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the request for the removal of one Rusty Leaf Fig tree.

BACKGROUND

Ms. Macke purchased the manor in March 2021, and is requesting the removal of one Rusty Leaf Fig tree, *Ficus, rubiginosa* located at the side of the manor. The reasons cited for the removal are structural damage and sewer damage. There are no additional signatures on the Mutual Request Form (Attachment 1).

The tree was last pruned in September of 2020. Future trimming is tentatively scheduled for fiscal year 2022. The height of the tree is approximately 42 feet with a trunk diameter of approximately 28 inches. The tree is growing approximately six feet from the patio area (Attachment 2).

DISCUSSION

At the time of inspection, the tree was found to be in fair condition with a well-balanced canopy, no pests were present, no prior pest damage, or trunk damage.

There are multiple surface roots with damage to several or the larger ones due to lawn mowers. The surface roots have reached into the Member's patio area; however, no visible damage was found during the inspection.

There are four additional trees in this area including two private fruit trees, one Desert Gum, *Eucalyptus, rudis,* and one Camphor Tree, *Cinnamomum, camphora*. These trees are approximately 12 feet from either side of the Rusty Leaf Fig tree, *Ficus, rubiginosa*.

There is a sewer clean-out approximately six feet from the tree with a number of surface roots in the general area. There have been two leak investigations and one mainline stoppage reported.

Due to the proximity to the manor, root trenching is not an option as the trench would be close to the main trunk and could cause potential failure in the future. With the removal of the tree, the other two large trees would fill the area and develop fuller canopies.

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

The cost to remove the tree is estimated at \$1,652, the cost to trim the tree is estimated at \$100. The estimated value of the tree is \$6,080 based on the tree inventory data.

Request

<u>Tree Removal</u>: Trees are essential for the reduction of pollutants in the atmosphere, the prevention of soil erosion, and the enhancement of the park-like appearance of Laguna Woods Village. Their removal is not taken lightly. However, circumstances do arise that potentially warrant tree removal/replacement.

Off-Schedule Trimming: Trees are trimmed on a cycle that is approximately 32-34 months in length
and shrubs are pruned three times per year. If desired, and approved by the managing agent and/or
the Mutual's Landscape Committee, trees or shrubs may be trimmed more frequently (off-schedule).
This work is typically performed as a chargeable service.

• <u>Plant Replacement</u>: Requests for the replacement of healthy plant material is generally denied. If granted, the work is typically performed as a chargeable service.

<u>Landscape Design Changes</u>: Any type of alteration to the current landscape layout must include a
design plan with description. It is also to include a list of plants and/or materials (stepping stones,
blocks, pavers, etc.) that are to be considered (if applicable).

<u>Structural/Sewer Damage</u>: Damage to buildings, sidewalks, sewer pipes, or other facilities may justify removal if corrective measures are not practical.

• Overgrown/Crowded: Trees or plants that have outgrown the available space may justify removal.

<u>Damaged/Declining Health</u>: Trees or plants that are declining in health will be evaluated for corrective action before removal/replacement is considered.

• <u>View Blockage</u>: By nature, view blockage must be reviewed case by case to determine the appropriate course of action.

• <u>Litter and Debris</u>: Because all trees shed litter seasonally, generally this is not an adequate reason to justify removal. However, if granted, removal/replacement may be at the resident's expense.

• <u>Personal Preference</u>: Because one does not like the appearance or other characteristics of the tree or plant generally does not justify its removal. However, if granted, removal/replacement is usually at the resident's expense.


