11. Member Comments (Items Not on the Agenda)

Email from 5460-A - Lynne Hodgman

Recently, during the last month, the landscape crew has done the following around my manor:

- 1. Cut off the blooming flowers of calla lilies, leaving broken stalks on the patio
- 2. Destroyed several patches, about a foot tall, of blooming flowers
- 3. Removed almost all the green leaves from a hedge
- 4. Cut a vertical hole in another hedge

The time for pruning is not spring blooming season!

Spring flowering shrubs (those that bloom before mid-June) should be pruned after flowering." This is readily available, standard practice that can be found on any horticultural site, for example, https://extension.psu.edu/how-and-when-to-prune-flowering-shrubs.

Removing small flowering plants does not make our landscape more attractive!

Removing greenery from privacy hedges negates the purpose of the hedges!

Please discuss this at your meeting. I am not the only resident who is experiencing the loss of blooming plants. I would like to see the destruction of our floral beauty stopped, with necessary pruning happening at the appropriate season."

Email from 969-2E - Wendy Stan

"Please do not cut or trim shrubs too short along the wall dividing properties by Wells Fargo and the Library in the summertime for privacy reasons. My neighbors and I would appreciate if you don't cut them too short."

12. Response to Member Comments

(Response to 5460-A) Mr. Wiemann stated that Landscape staff visits each manor four times a year. Staff trims what they can when they can. He realizes a lot of shrubs were let to run wild. Staff is in the process of getting them back under control.

SUBJECT: Tree Removal Request: 3135-B Via Serena N. (Yang) – One Canary Island

Pine tree

RECOMMENDATION

Deny the request for the removal of one Canary Island Pine tree.

BACKGROUND

Mr. Yang purchased the manor in August 2011, and is requesting the removal of one Canary Island Pine tree, *Pinus, canariensis*. The reasons cited for the removal are sewer damage, structural damage, and litter/debris. The resident also stated a slip hazard due to the pine needles, as well as the killing of the turf area by the needles. The resident included a statement with their request that purports to illustrate the dangers of the dropping pine cones. There are five additional signatures on the Mutual Request Form in favor of the tree removal (Attachment 2).

The tree was last pruned in December 2017. Future trimming is tentatively scheduled for fiscal year 2021. The height of the tree is approximately 50 feet with a trunk diameter of approximately 20 inches. The tree is approximately 12 feet from the manor, six feet from the common walkway, 12 feet from the manor's entrance walkway, and 21 feet from the trash enclosure (Attachment 1).

DISCUSSION

At the time of inspection, the tree was found to be in good condition with a well-shaped root flare, some bleeding of sap (which is typical this time of year), no noticeable pests, disease, or damage to the trunk. There are a number of pine cones in the tree (this is seasonal with these types of trees) with accompanying large amounts of new flushing growth. The walkway has been ground down to prevent any offsets and there are several cracks in the walkways near the laundry room. However, staff does not believe the cracks are caused by this tree. There is one noticeable small surface root approximately 15 feet from the tree and five feet from the manor which can be ground down. The turf area surrounding the tree is in a healthy state with no bare areas. Since 2011 there have been 73 assorted tickets generate for this manor including 12 for clippings/leaves pick up and dirty sidewalk. There has been one plumbing ticket for a multi-fixture stoppage in September 2013, with no mention of tree roots.

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

The cost to remove the tree is estimated at \$1,475. The cost to trim the tree is estimated at \$100 and the estimated value of the tree is \$4,813 based on the tree inventory data.




Endangering Pine Tree


This is an attachment to Mutual Landscape Request Formp.

Manor #: 3135-B

This pine tree produces *Life* endangeous pine cones which are extra heavy and solid, just above the sidewalk.

Below shows that the pine cones drop area on the sidewalk where residents might get hit by them. Our neighbor, Debbie, told us that one pine cones suddenly fell in front of her when she walked.





Each pine cone weights about 1 pound that such a free fall could bring concussion-brain damage if people get hit on head.

The sidewalk is commonly used by neighbors, residents, dog walkers, variety of workers, mailman, visitors, and delivery men.

We also concern about the structural and sewer damages from its spreading roots.



Conclusion

We, as neighbors, raise the safety issue and sincerely request removing the pine tree for a safe piece of mind.

SUBJECT: Proposed Turf Reduction Project in CDS 343

RECOMMENDATION

Direct staff to proceed with the construction of the project.

BACKGROUND

The Third Mutual Board of Directors has determined that reducing costs related to water consumption is a priority. Turf reduction has been identified as a viable way to reduce irrigation water use. In 2019, Third Mutual successfully completed a turf reduction project in Gate 14 with \$4,800 in anticipated annual savings in water use and maintenance.

DISCUSSION

Staff has been directed by the Landscape Committee to determine areas within Third Mutual that are good candidates for turf removal projects. The parking island in CDS 343 is a good candidate for one of these projects (Attachment 1). Additionally, with the reorganization of the Landscape Department, staff will be able to complete this project using in-house crews.

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

The estimated cost for the project is \$9,650 (Attachment 2).






