8. Reports

a) Department Reports

Mr. Hartley commented that the main focus in the Landscape Division is on the mowing schedules. The Division has been testing Avenger and other organic pesticide products. During the cooler months we will be start landscape renovation projects. Unscheduled trimming of Carrotwood trees is currently underway in United Mutual.

b) Irrigation Status Report
Mr. Hartley gave an overview of the irrigation status report and
explained the attached graphs showing a reduction in water use.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION AND CONSIDERATION

9. Evaluation of Alternative Herbicides

Mr. Hartley gave an overview of the alternative herbicides.

Applications would be tested in specific cul-de-sacs; existing equipment will be cleaned prior to testing.

Testing would start in about two weeks and will take 100 days, to determine how effective the products are.

Staff will not treat yellow staked areas. Residents are not to apply any products during testing.

.The motion to approve staff's recommendation passed unanimously.

10.Tree Removal Requests

- a) 738-D Avenida Majorca (Rhee) Recommendation: The Committee recommends denial of the request to remove the tree, and recommended trimming on schedule. The tree was found to be in good condition with no visible pests or disease, and no evidence of property damage.
- b) 835-P Ronda Sevilla (Hunt) The Committee recommends denial of the removal of the tree. The tree was found to be in good condition with no visible pests or disease, and no evidence of property damage.
- c) 407-C Avenida Castilla (Choi) The Committee recommends approval of the removal of the tree.
- d) 2001-A Via Mariposa (Serrano) The Committee denied removal of the tree and recommended off schedule trimming in September. The tree was found to be in good condition with no evidence of pests or disease and no evidence of property damage.

Note: 781-C (Rubin). The Committee directed the member to trim the tree away from the building within sixty days at member's expense. Compliance will be notified of the decision.

RECOMMENDATION

Receive and file this report.

BACKGROUND

Irrigation water usage and charges for April through September, typically the months with the highest water demand, are provided to the Committee each meeting to show trends from 2015 to present.


DISCUSSION

Water use data collected for June and July 2015 through 2018 reveals water consumption increased in 2018 compared to previous years. July 2018 reflects a decrease in usage from June 2018 for Irrigation and Mixed Consumption. See Attachment 1.

There was no rainfall in June or July 2017 and for the same period in 2018. The evapotranspiration (Et) rate for both months reflect an increase from 2017; meaning that the plants' demand for water was higher. See Attachment 2. The Village computerized irrigation systems use Et to determine the optimum amount to irrigate by calculating the loss of moisture in the soil through evaporation and plant transpiration.

The attached charts show an increase in usage compared to previous years. This is presumably a result in the higher Et, which reflects higher irrigation demands and the likely increase in residential usage. The decrease in water usage from June to July 2018 is most likely a result of less water being used by residents.

It is apparent from the graph on the following page that Irrigation and Mixed Consumption year-to-date in 2018 for United Mutual is lower than budget.





UNITED MUTUAL APRIL - SEPTEMBER WATER CONSUMPTION TRENDS









LANDSCAPE DIVISION Rainfall and Evapotranspiration Trends







It's a sunny day and the crop is absorbing available soil water from the root zone (root depth). As a result of humidity and temperature, water transpires through the leaves and evaporates from the soil into the atmosphere. This process is called EvapoTranspiration. When it rains, with low humidity and temperature, this process does not occur.

SUBJECT: Appeal of Denied Tree Removal Request – Han (26-D) – Shamel Ash

RECOMMENDATION

Deny the request for the removal of one Shamel Ash tree located at 26-D and trim on schedule.

BACKGROUND

The Landscape Committee considered the tree removal request submitted by Mr. Han at the regular meeting of June 14, 2018. The committee voted unanimously to deny the request to remove the tree. Mr. Han is appealing the decision to deny the removal and is requesting the Landscape Committee reconsider.

Mr. Han purchased the manor in July 1999. He is requesting the removal of one Shamel Ash tree, *Fraxinus uhdei*, located at the side of his manor in the shrub bed area. See Attachment 1. The reasons cited for the request are: sewer damage, overgrown, litter/debris, damage to the A/C unit from falling leaves and dangerously close to building with many roots above the ground. Surrounding neighbors have signed the Landscape Request Form in favor of the removal. See Attachment 2.

DISCUSSION

The tree was last pruned in September of 2015 and is scheduled for pruning again in approximately October-November 2018. It is approximately 46 feet in height with a trunk diameter of approximately 32 inches and is growing approximately five feet from the sidewalk and building.

At the time of inspection, the tree was found to be in fair condition with some noticeable deadwood and decay. To date there is no record of any mainline stoppages associated with this manor. The Committee visited the site in June and observed no damage to property or infrastructure that would warrant removal. Conditions have not changed.

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

The cost to remove the tree is estimated at \$2,600, cost to trim is estimated at \$650 and the estimated value is \$7,155 based on ArborPro tree inventory.

In addition to the reasons we cited in our request of July 12, 2018, copy attached, we would like to appeal your decision to trim the tree, instead of removing it, as follows.

- 1. The canopy of the tree encroaches the entire 16.5-foot length of our patio at a depth of approximately 7 feet at its bulk. One branch is now approximating a depth of 11 feet into the patio.
- 2. The tree was trimmed in the summer of 2017; however, it did not provide any relief from the inordinate volume of berries and leaves that it constantly drops. In fact, the problem has gotten significantly worse. At the time we were told that the tree could not be trimmed so that the canopy would not cover our patio. <u>Unless the tree can be trimmed so the canopy doesn't encroach our patio, trimming is not a viable solution for us.</u>
- 3. As you know, this is no ordinary tree. The virtually year-round constant and overwhelming amount of litter that the tree produces is out of place in a retirement community. It seems even more out of place that our neighbor in Manor 2004C has to sweep the common area sidewalk under the tree as the volume of litter also affects her.
- 4. Please note that seven neighbors signed in favor of our request for removal, instead of three neighbors as erroneously reported on the Staff Report dated August 9, 2018.
- 5. It appears as if tree canopies covering patios or balconies is not a common problem in our section of Laguna Woods. As we were told in the board meeting of August 14, 2018, there are thousands of Brazilian Pepper trees in Laguna Woods. We have begun walking around the neighborhood to see and document if any manors had such trees covering their patio. So far, after seeing over 160 manors we haven't seen any branches, of any kind of tree, growing more than a handful of inches over any patio wall or balcony. Is our manor an exception?

Under separate cover we will be requesting information regarding the policy for encroachment by common area trees and whether there has been any request for removal of this particular tree in the past.

SUBJECT: Request for Tree Removal: Serrano (2001-A) – Brazilian Pepper

RECOMMENDATION

Deny the request for the removal of one Brazilian Pepper and perform an off-schedule trimming in September 2018 to reduce the canopy.

BACKGROUND

Ms. Serrano purchased the manor in January 2017. She is requesting the removal of a Brazilian Pepper tree, *Schinus terebinthifloius*, located at the front of her manor in the raised shrub bed. See Attachment 1. The reasons cited by her for the removal are: heavy litter/debris, seeds generated from the tree are potentially dangerous for her dog if eaten and damage to the laminate floor from tracking in the berries on shoes. Three neighbors have signed the request in favor of the removal. See Attachment 2.

The tree was last pruned in June 2017 and is scheduled for pruning again in June 2020. It is approximately 36 feet in height with a trunk diameter of approximately 31 inches and is growing approximately three to four feet from the patio wall.

DISCUSSION

At the time of inspection, the tree was found to be in good condition with no visible decay, pests or trunk damage. There are noticeable surface roots with no observable damage to the adjacent patio wall. There has been concrete grinding performed on the walkway to prevent any trip hazards and the walkway approaching the manor has been replaced. Although the tree was trimmed over a year ago, it has grown to the size where clearance trimming will be required prior to the scheduled trimming. Staff will trim to reduce end weight and the crown of the tree.

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

The cost to remove the tree is estimated to be \$2,100. The cost to trim the tree is estimated to be \$550; with an estimated value is \$9,460 based on the ArborPro tree inventory.

Attachment to Mutual Landscape Request Form Reason for Request - Tree Removal 2001 Via Mariposa W, Unit A Owners: Sergio & Maureen Serrano. July, 12, 2018

The tree is a very large Brazilian pepper tree that is 5 feet from our patio wall. The canopy extends 7 feet over our patio and produces very large amounts of litter, not on a seasonal basis, but for most of the year. The litter is primarily composed of ripe berries and dead leaves. The berry is hazardous to our dog and is deteriorating our laminate flooring in the house.

The tree was trimmed late last summer and we were then told that it could not be trimmed so that the canopy would not cover the patio. Hence, we are requesting removal of the tree for the reasons detailed below:

- From approximately January through October, 10 months out of the year, the tree drops copious amounts of red berries and other litter inside our patio and, to a lesser extent, inside our atrium 30 feet away. We have tried to live with this tree for 14 months now, however, the daily maintenance required in our patio and walkway is distressing to us. A tree that sheds large volumes of litter right inside one's patio seems out of place in a retirement community.
- Unfortunately, our dog enjoys eating the berries. The berries are mildly toxic. Consequently, we are unable to allow her in the patio without continuous 100% supervision as the berries that may fall after the patio is swept cause her gastric problems including vomiting. Worse yet, the berries release a substance that causes skin irritation (dermatitis) to her paws. Although Maureen Serrano is a retired Veterinary Technician registered with the State of California, and is qualified to manage dermatitis in dogs, on one occasion the dermatitis was severe enough to cause an expensive visit to a veterinary in order to get prescription medication.
- The new laminate floor inside the house is deteriorating as a result of the berries. Even though we wipe our feet on two floor mats and manually remove the berries embedded in the shoe soles, a sap-like substance manages to mark the floor. The substance won't scrape off without damage to the floor and requires getting down on the floor and the use of tar/adhesive removers, which are not approved cleaners by the manufacturer of the laminate floor, with extensive elbow grease. Again, that seems out of place in a retirement community.
- All the neighbors that signed this request use the sidewalk in the common area under the tree and they all expressed their annoyance with the litter. Others complained about the berries being a nuisance as they track onto their floors. Additionally, and for your information, two neighbors said that during the rainy season they have slipped on the accumulation of berries and leaves.
- The excessive debris from this tree in our patio precludes us from installing a patio cover.

Ingestion

Pepper tree is listed by the University of California as a Class 2, minor toxicity plant when ingested by humans. This means it can cause you to feel sick if you ingest it but isn't likely to be deadly. The same symptoms may occur when your pet ingests the plants. The ASPCA reports the plant can cause gastrointestinal irritation. This irritation may lead to vomiting, diarrhea, heaving or a general appearance of feeling unwell in dogs. If your dog ingests any part of the plant, not just the berries, call your vet for guidance. Any plant can cause a reaction in an animal that can be minor or serious.



With their interesting weeping forms, delicate leaflets, and profuse flowers and berries, both California pepper tree (Schinus molle) and Brazilian pepper tree (Schinus terebinthifolius) are favorites for some. But they are shunned by others. Both trees provide dense shade, with California pepper tree growing 25 to 40 feet tall in U. S. Department of Agriculture plant hardiness zones 8 through 11 and Brazilian pepper tree growing 15 to 30 feet tall in USDA zones 9 through 11.

Both California and Brazilian pepper trees appear on invasive lists in some states, meaning they crowd out native plants and destroy the habitat for animals that depend on native plants. In some cases, the listings also mean it is illegal to own or grow the plant. Pepper trees spread primarily through birds and small mammals eating the prolific berries and spreading seeds.

With their prolific berries and to 6-inch clusters of flowers, pepper trees produce a lot of little by the incurrence branches on both trees that break frequently, with or without wind, and the numerous leaflets that fall even through the trees are evergreen. Female California pepper trees produce berries twice a year, in fall and winter, adding more litter to be cleaned up from yards, sidewalks or brushed off of parked cars.

Problematic Root Systems

The California pepper tree has roots that go everywhere and anywhere in search of water and nutrients, making it drought-tolerant but problematic. Its surface roots make it impossible to grow anything under the tree and the roots' aggressive qualities break pavements and invade sewers and drains. Brazilian pepper tree roots produce suckers that give the tree a dense thicket appearance if they are not removed.

Toxic Properties

Pepper trees belong to the Anacardiaceae family, as do other poisonous plants, including poison oak (Toxicodendron diversilobum), which grows in USDA zones 5 through 9. Not surprisingly, the attractive leaflets of pepper trees can cause similar allergic skin reactions in some people as do the other poisonous plants. If eaten by people or pets, the berries of Brazilian pepper trees cause gastric problems.

SUBJECT: Request for Removal of Three Palms by Mr. Choi (301-D)

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the request for the removal of three Queen Palms located a 301-D.

BACKGROUND

Mr. Choi purchased the manor in February 2018. He is requesting the removal of three Queen Palms, *Syagrus romanzoffianum*, located at the front of the manor in the shrub bed. See Attachment 1. The reason cited by him is excessive litter/debris. See Attachment 2.

The palms were last trimmed in November 2016 and are scheduled for pruning again in approximately November 2018. They are approximately 25 feet in height with a trunk diameter of approximately 12 inches and are growing approximately one to two feet from the building.

DISCUSSION

At the time of inspection, the palms were found to be in good condition with no visible decay, pests or trunk damage. While they were planted too close to the building to allow for their mature size; there is no visible damage to the building. This species of palm requires additional trimming throughout the year due to the rapid growth of the fronds and seed pods. Staff recommends the removal of these palms due to the proximity to the building and the multiple pruning cycles required each year to alleviate the heavy debris and hanging fronds.

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

The cost to remove the three palms is estimated to be \$1,200. The cost to trim them is estimated to be \$300, with an estimated value of \$2,743 based on ArborPro tree inventory.





SUBJECT: Request for Off Scheduled Trimming by Abrams (851-0) – 20 Brush Cherry

Trees

RECOMMENDATION

Deny the request for the Off-Schedule Trimming of 20 Bush Cherry trees and trim on schedule.

BACKGROUND

Mr. Abrams purchased the manor in September 2013. He is requesting the off-schedule trimming of 20 Brush Cherry trees, *Syzgium paniculatum*, located at the rear of his manor in the shrub bed. These trees were planted to screen the back of the carport from adjacent homes. Mr. Abrams is requesting three to four feet of crown reduction. See Attachment 1. The reasons cited by him for the off schedule trimming are: personal preference, overgrown, view obstruction and cuts out light into his manor. Four additional neighbors have signed the request in support of the off-schedule trimming/crown reduction. See Attachment 2.

The trees were last pruned in November 2016 and are scheduled for pruning again in November 2019. They are approximately 25 feet in height with trunk diameters of approximately seven inches. They are growing approximately four to six feet from the sidewalk and approximately 20 feet from the balcony of the manor.

DISCUSSION

At the time of inspection, the trees were found to be in good condition with no visible decay, pests or trunk damage. There is some branch die-back, which will be removed during the next trimming cycle. The trees are properly spaced and create the intended screen for the back of the carport. Staff will perform crown reduction of the trees when in the area.

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

The cost to trim all of the trees is estimated at \$1,400; with an estimated value of \$9,400 based on ArborPro tree inventory.



SUBJECT: Request for Tree Removal by Romero (89-F) – Brazilian Pepper tree

RECOMMENDATION

Deny the request for the removal of one Brazilian Pepper tree located at 89-F and trim onschedule.

BACKGROUND

Ms. Romero purchased the manor in April 2006. She is requesting the removal of a Brazilian Pepper tree, *Schinus terebinthefolius*, located at the front of her manor in the lawn area. See Attachment 1. The reasons cited by her for the removal are: the tree attracts a large number of bees and produces a heavy pollen, which affects her allergies. See Attachment 2.

The tree was last trimmed in January 2017 and is scheduled for pruning again in approximately January 2020. The tree is approximately 19 feet in height with a trunk diameter of approximately 15 inches and is growing approximately six to seven feet from the building.

DISCUSSION

At the time of inspection, the tree was found to be in good condition with no visible decay, pests or trunk damage. There is some noticeable surface rooting which is not causing any structural damage. The tree has a balanced canopy and is well placed. Currently there is no policy for the removal of a tree due to allergies. Six neighbors signed the Landscape Request Form in support of removal.

FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

The cost to remove the tree is estimated at \$1,200. The cost to trim the tree is estimated at \$300, with an estimated value of \$2,743 based on ArborPro tree inventory.


