

## GATES 1 AND 9 CLOSED



Gates 1 and 9 are closed for the radio frequency identification decal (RFID) retrofit. The construction team estimates this phase to be complete within six weeks. During construction, Gates 1 and 9 will be closed to vehicle traffic. However, Gate 1 will allow for pedestrian and golf cart access, and Gate 9 will allow for pedestrian access (see below for adjusted hours for both gates). A temporary gatehouse will be stationed at each gate. Gate entrance hours will be adjusted to ensure efficient access to the Community and quick response by emergency personnel. No bus routes will be affected.



## CHANNEL 3 ANALOG GUIDE USERS WILL NEED AN HD DEVICE TO GET NEW iGUIDE




After Friday, May 31, Broadband Services is discontinuing the Channel 3 analog television guide. This means that a channel guide will no longer be available to those Residents whose televisions are plugged directly into the wall cable outlet. In order to receive the new digital interactive guide, Residents must rent an HD converter for \$7.95 per month or any of our other HD set-top boxes. Renting the HD converter gives Residents the most up-to-date digital iGuide available and eliminates the need for periodic channel scans—channels simply will display the correct number. The HD set-top devices also eliminate the need for decimal-point channel numbers, such as 7.1, 8.4, etc.

“We cannot turn back time to the age of analog television,” said Broadband Services Director Chuck Holland. “We must continue to make modest improvements to the cable system to keep up with the changing technology. The Channel 3 guide is a legacy system designed for analog televisions, which hasn’t been supported the by cable television industry since 2008.”

*Pictured here is the completed install of the new Community Center HVAC equipment.*


The Community Center HVAC rooftop equipment installation was completed on May 12, which now gives crews the opportunity to replace the legacy roof with a new PVC cool flat roof. This upgrade is scheduled to begin Saturday, June 8.

Roofing materials will be loaded onto the roof by crane on Saturday, June 8, from 5 a.m. until 3 p.m. For the safety of our Residents, the parking area on the north side of the building will be closed to all vehicle and pedestrian traffic during this time.

However, while the scheduled roof work is underway, the Community Center building and other parking areas adjacent to the building will remain open for normal weekend activities.

Roof replacement work will continue during normal business hours from Monday, June 10, through Friday, June 21, with no parking restrictions around the Community Center.


## THIRD MUTUAL GOLF CART POLICIES AND PROCEDURES AMENDMENT

An article in the [May 2019 Village Breeze](#) incorrectly listed the fine for the first violation as \$50. The [first violation is in fact \\$100](#); fines increase in increments of \$50 for subsequent violations. The fines are capped at \$250. The member must obtain the annual electric golf cart charging decal within 10 days of the violation.
