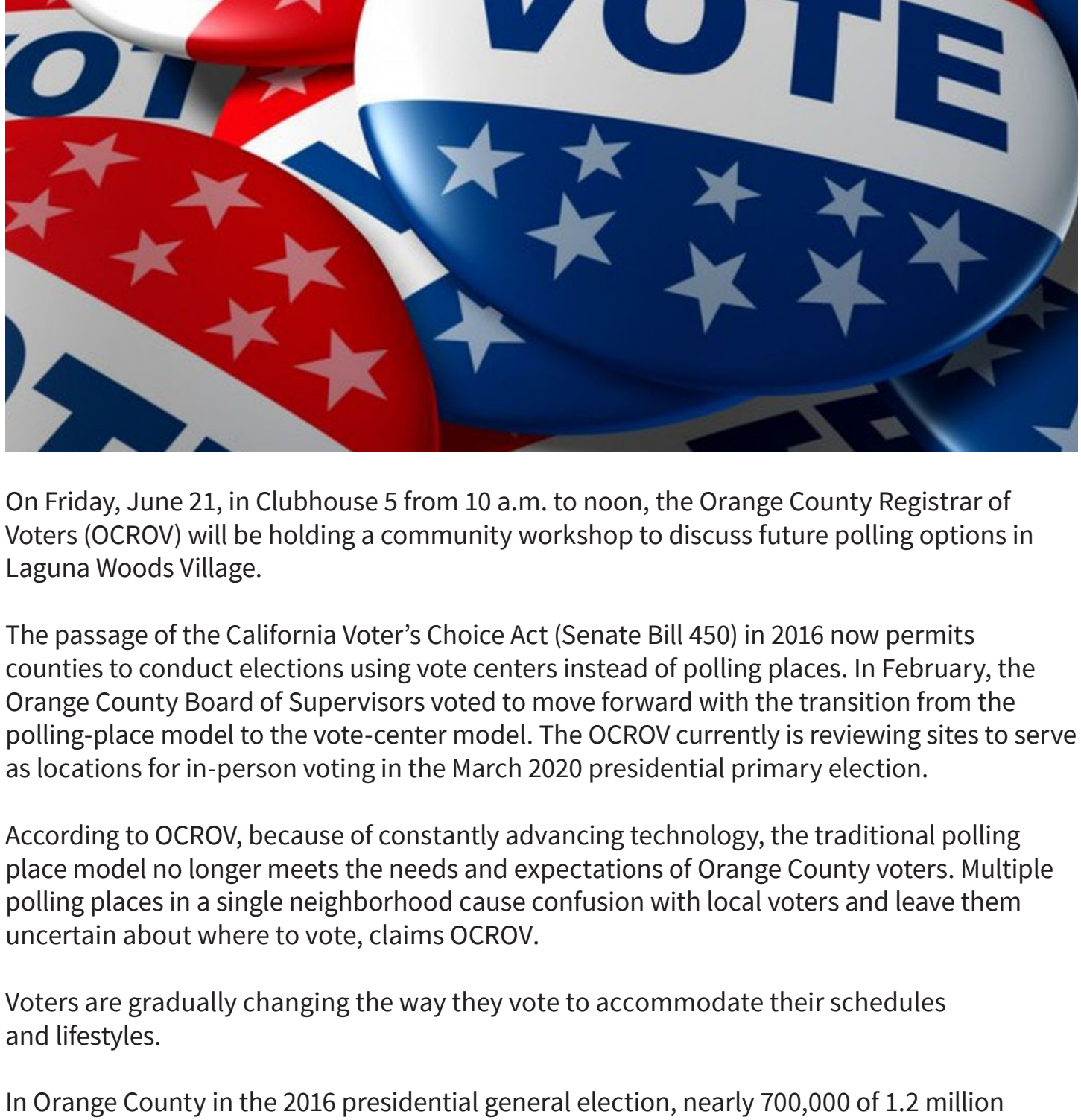


TOWN HALL MEETING TO ADDRESS VILLAGE POLLING CENTERS



On Friday, June 21, in Clubhouse 5 from 10 a.m. to noon, the Orange County Registrar of Voters (OCROV) will be holding a community workshop to discuss future polling options in Laguna Woods Village.

The passage of the California Voter's Choice Act (Senate Bill 450) in 2016 now permits counties to conduct elections using vote centers instead of polling places. In February, the Orange County Board of Supervisors voted to move forward with the transition from the polling-place model to the vote-center model. The OCROV currently is reviewing sites to serve as locations for in-person voting in the March 2020 presidential primary election.

According to OCROV, because of constantly advancing technology, the traditional polling place model no longer meets the needs and expectations of Orange County voters. Multiple polling places in a single neighborhood cause confusion with local voters and leave them uncertain about where to vote, claims OCROV.

Voters are gradually changing the way they vote to accommodate their schedules and lifestyles.

In Orange County in the 2016 presidential general election, nearly 700,000 of 1.2 million ballots cast were vote-by-mail ballots. Currently, 61 percent of all registered voters have signed up for permanent vote-by-mail status. The number of voters casting ballots at the polling place has dropped 20 percentage points since 2004.

The OCROV presentation will include an overview of the vote-center model and provide the opportunity for Residents to contribute suggestions regarding the transition. Village Residents also will have an opportunity to ask questions and complete a survey to share their feedback.

GET POWER OUTAGE NOTIFICATIONS AND ALERTS FROM SCE



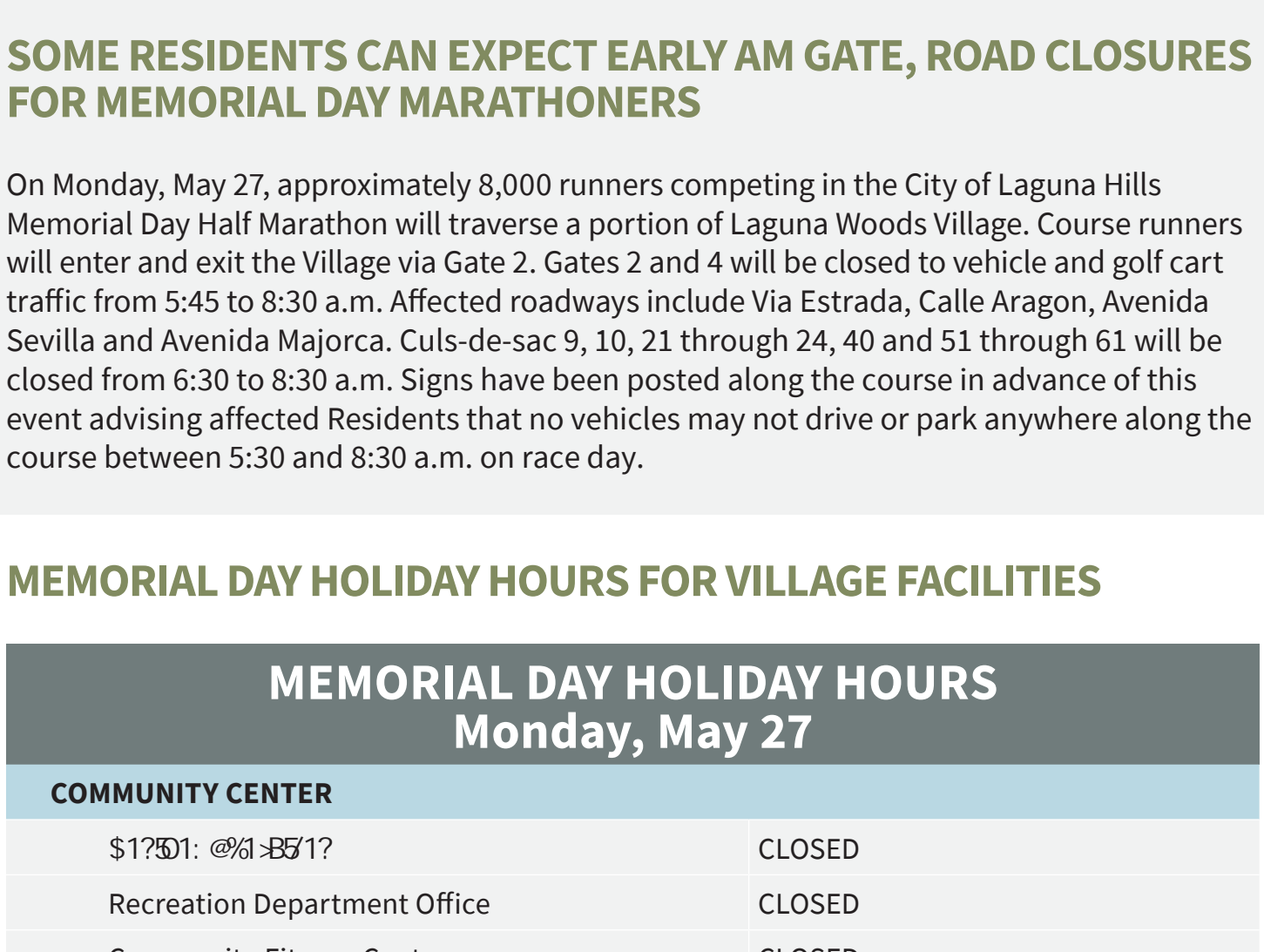
Southern California Edison (SCE) has been working in the Village to upgrade and replace aged cables and transformers.

SCE will be scheduling future maintenance and is obligated to notify affected customers via letter 10 days in advance or via text at least 72 hours prior to the outages. If you receive a letter in a business-size envelope with a large yellow stripe on the front, it is likely from SCE. Always be on the lookout for important notifications.

Because unplanned outages can happen at any time, we strongly recommend that any Village Resident who depends on electrical power due to a health issue register with SCE. Click [here](#) to apply for the Medical Baseline Allowance program; SCE automatically contacts program participants in the event of a Stage 3 Emergency rotating outage.

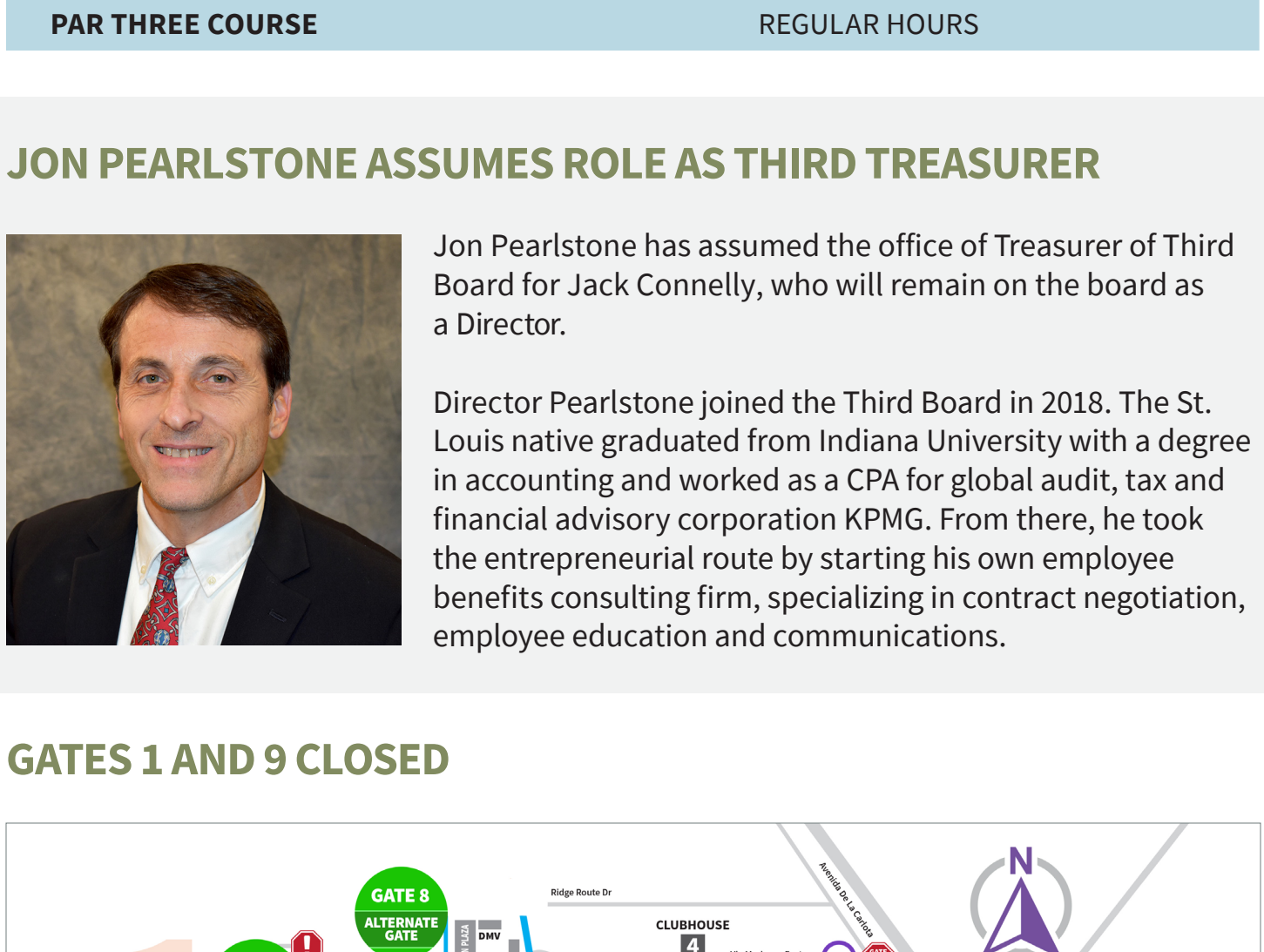

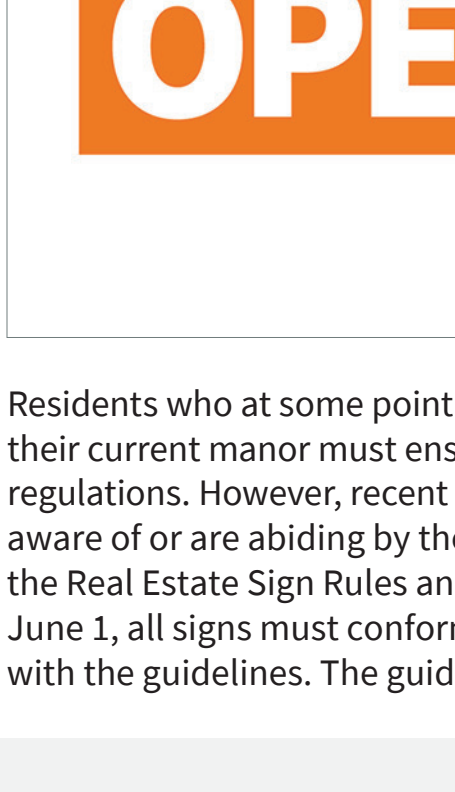
SOME RESIDENTS CAN EXPECT EARLY AM GATE, ROAD CLOSURES FOR MEMORIAL DAY MARATHONERS

On Monday, May 27, approximately 8,000 runners competing in the City of Laguna Hills Memorial Day Half Marathon will traverse a portion of Laguna Woods Village. Course runners will enter and exit the Village via Gate 2. Gates 2 and 4 will be closed to vehicle and golf cart traffic from 5:45 to 8:30 a.m. Affected roadways include Via Estrada, Calle Aragon, Avenida Sevilla and Avenida Majorca. Culs-de-sac 9, 10, 21 through 24, 40 and 51 through 61 will be closed from 6:30 to 8:30 a.m. Signs have been posted along the course in advance of this event advising affected Residents that no vehicles may not drive or park anywhere along the course between 5:30 and 8:30 a.m. on race day.

GATES 1 AND 9 CLOSED



Gates 1 and 9 are closed for the radio frequency identification decal (RFID) retrofit. The construction team estimates this phase to be complete within six weeks. During construction, Gates 1 and 9 will be closed to vehicle traffic. However, Gate 1 will allow for pedestrian and golf cart access, and Gate 9 will allow for pedestrian access (see below for adjusted hours for both gates). A temporary gatehouse will be stationed at each gate. Gate entrance hours will be adjusted to ensure efficient access to the Community and quick response by emergency personnel. No bus routes will be affected.

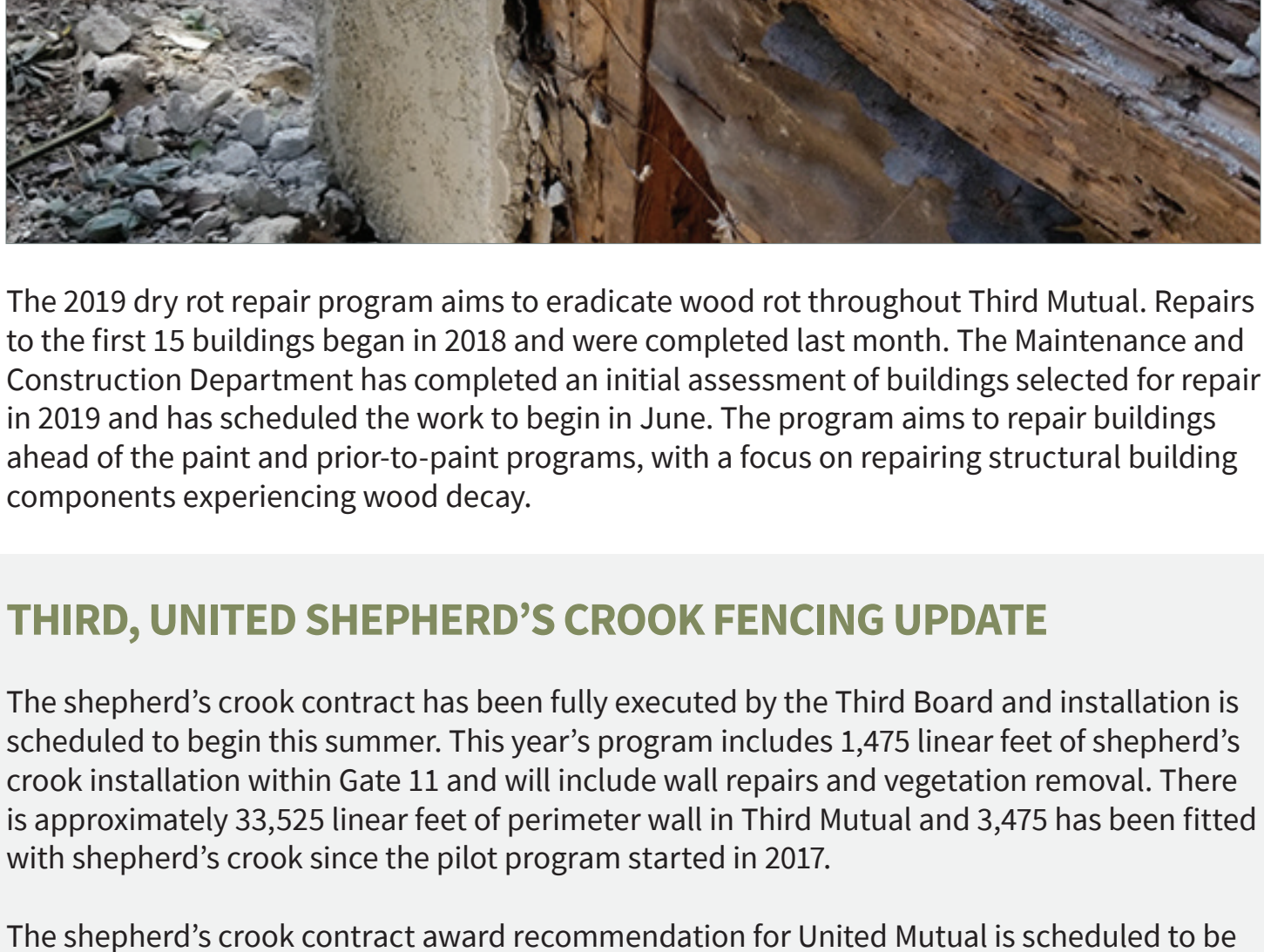

LEARN ABOUT MEDICARE COSTS AND RELATED TOPICS AT HICAP, SOCIAL SERVICES EVENT



For Residents who need help with Medicare costs, the Laguna Woods Village Social Services Department and the Health Insurance Counseling and Advocacy Program (HICAP) will co-host an informational meeting on Wednesday, May 29, in Clubhouse 7.

HICAP counselors can help attendees apply for programs to save money through prescription drug plan premiums and co-payments, as well as Medicare Part B premiums, co-payments and co-insurance. Counselors can also help Residents compare health and drug plans and costs, and explain how benefits coordinate with other health coverage.

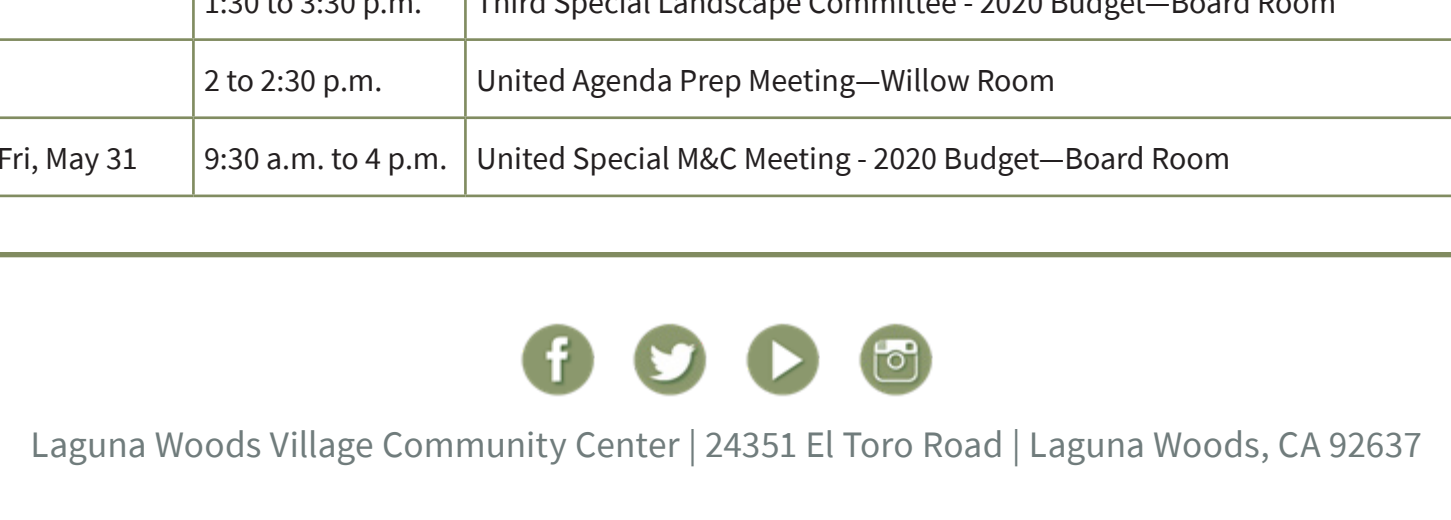
For appointments regarding assistance with prescription drug-related costs, attendees should bring their Medicare card and other health insurance plan cards, as well as medication bottles or a list of medications (include name, dosage and frequency).

For assistance with other programs, attendees should bring proof of income (bank statements, SSA benefit award letter, last pay stub, tax return), proof of resources (bank statements, life insurance policy, vehicle registration), proof of identity (Social Security card, California ID/driver's license or passport) and proof of expenses (Medicare premiums and other medical plan premiums).

CHANNEL 3 ANALOG GUIDE USERS WILL NEED AN HD DEVICE TO GET NEW iGUIDE



After Friday, May 31, the Channel 3 analog television guide is no longer available to Broadband Services from any vendor. This year's program includes 1,475 linear feet of shepherd's crook installation within Gate 11 and will include wall repairs and vegetation removal. There is approximately 33,525 linear feet of perimeter wall in Third Mutual and 3,475 has been fitted with shepherd's crook since the pilot program started in 2017.

"We cannot turn back time to the age of analog television," said Broadband Services Director Chuck Holland. "We must continue to make modest improvements to the cable system to keep up with changing technology. The Channel 3 guide is a legacy system designed for analog televisions, which hasn't been supported by the cable television industry since 2008." REAL ESTATE AGENTS MUST FOLLOW SIGN RULES AND REGS

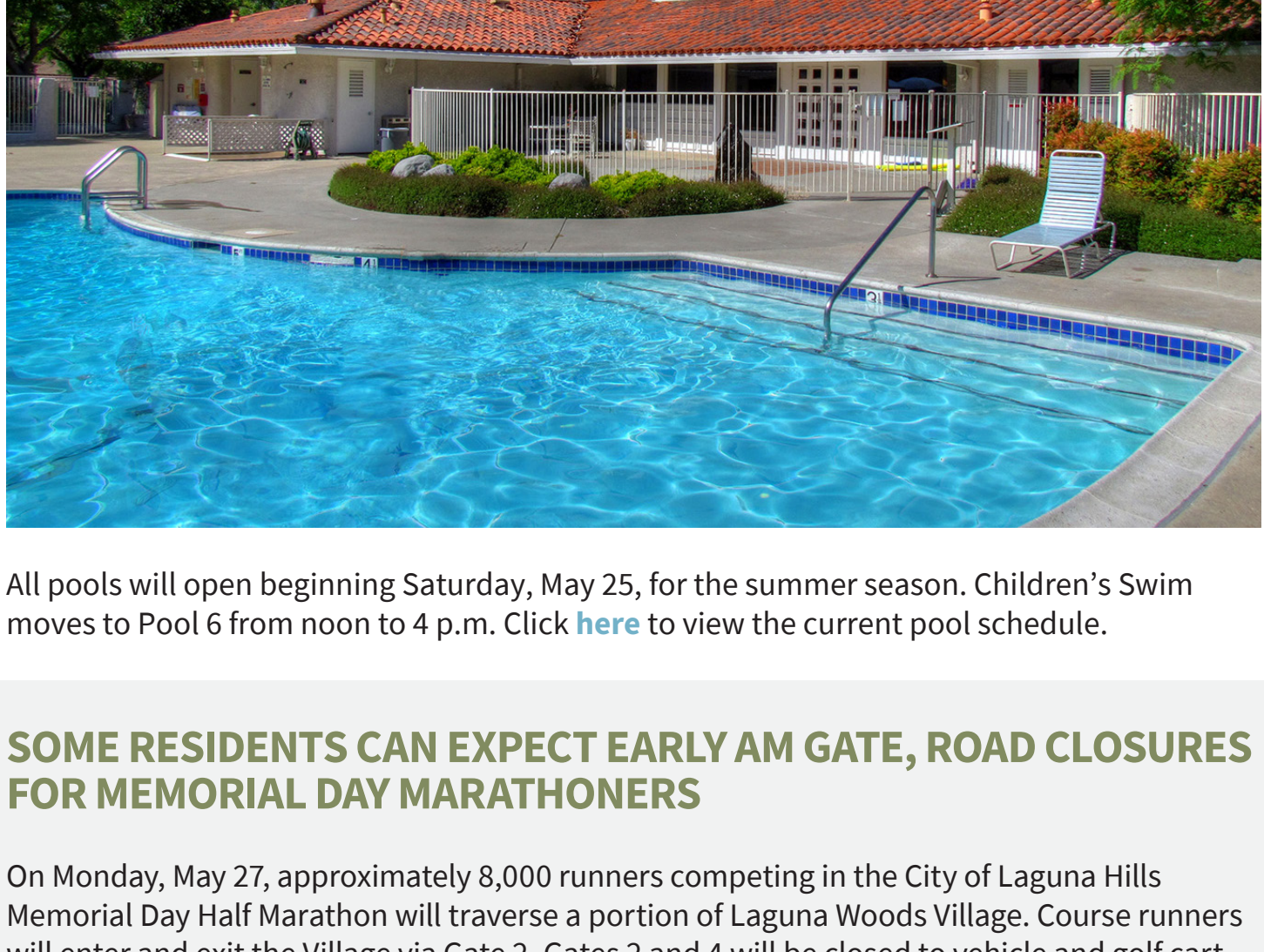

GRF, Third and United are committed to enforcing the Real Estate Sign Rules and Regulations that have been in effect for decades. Rabies vaccinations will be \$12 each (plus a \$3 medical waste disposal fee). A complete selection of other dog and cat vaccinations also will be available at low prices, as well as special combination packs to allow for greater savings when multiple vaccinations are purchased. Flea-control products NexGard, Bravecto and Trifexis also will be available for purchase. To participate, all dogs must be leashed, and all cats must be in carriers. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS TASK FORCE HOSTS CPR/AED CLASS

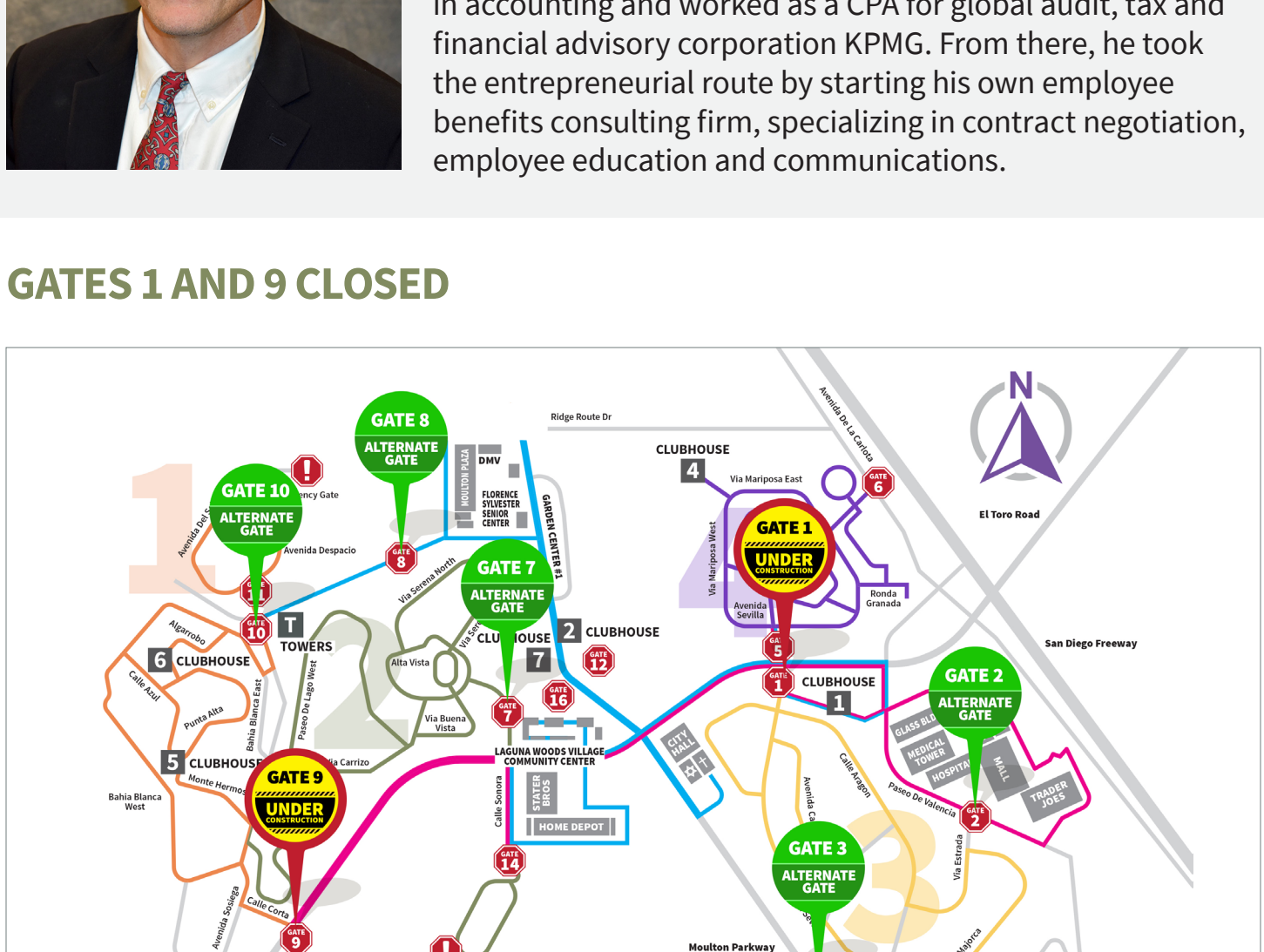

LAGUNA WOODS CITY HALL TO HOLD PUBLIC BENEFITS ELIGIBILITY EVENT

On Wednesday, June 5, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., Supervisor Lisa Bartlett, the Orange County Board of Supervisors and the County of Orange Social Services Agency will host a benefit enrollment event at Laguna Woods City Hall, where Village Residents can determine if they qualify for CalFresh, Medi-Cal and General Relief public assistance. 2019 DRY ROT REPAIR PROGRAM TO BEGIN IN THIRD IN JUNE



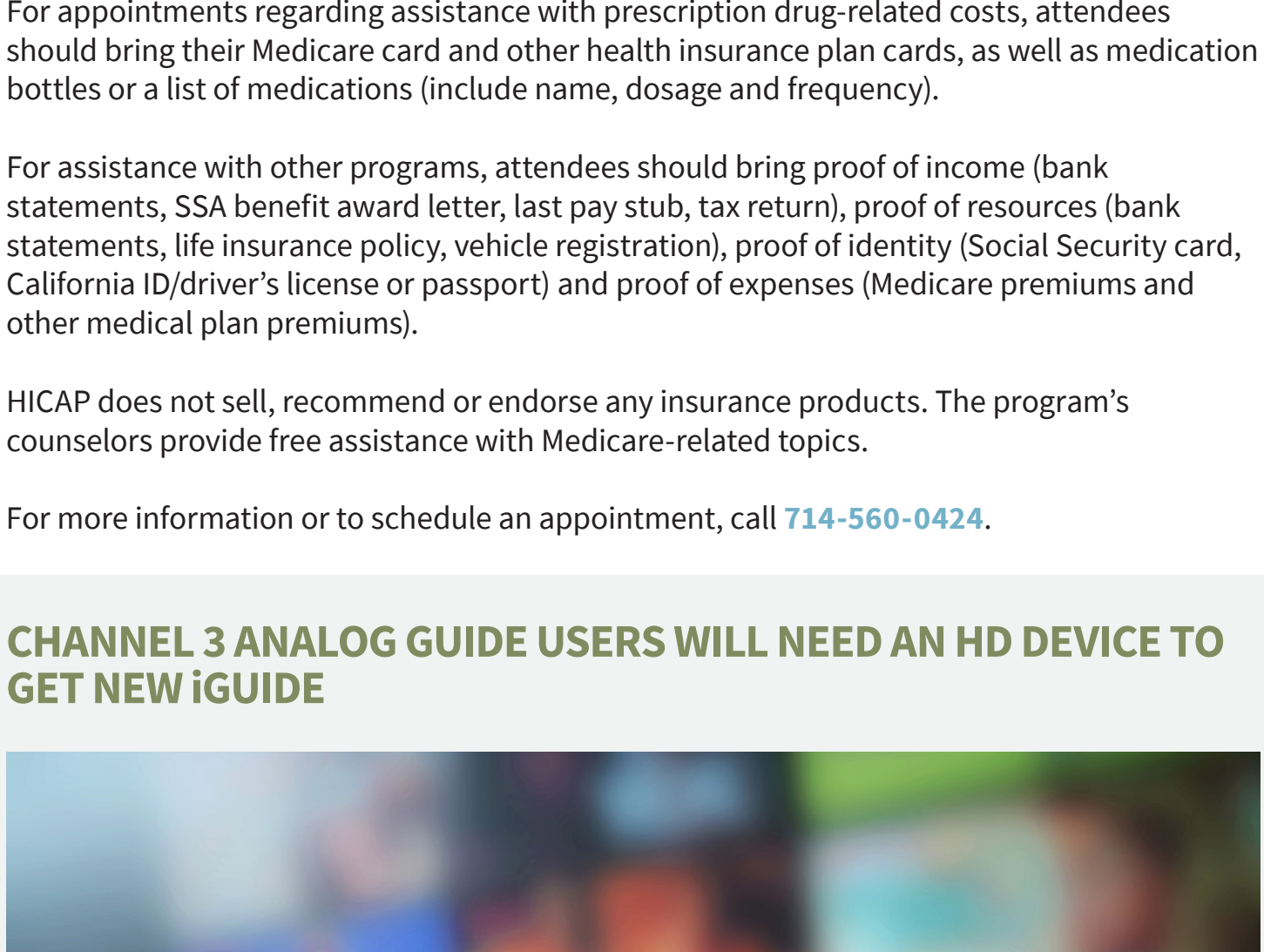
The 2019 dry rot repair program aims to eradicate wood rot throughout Third Mutual. Repairs to the first 15 buildings began in 2018 and were completed last month. The Maintenance and Construction Department has completed an initial assessment of buildings selected for repair in 2019 and has scheduled the work to begin in June. The program aims to repair buildings ahead of the paint and prior-to-paint programs, with a focus on repairing structural building components experiencing wood decay.

THIRD, UNITED SHEPHERD'S CROOK FENCING UPDATE

The shepherd's crook contract has been fully executed by the Third Board and installation is scheduled to begin this summer. This year's program includes 1,475 linear feet of shepherd's crook installation within Gate 11 and will include wall repairs and vegetation removal. There is approximately 33,525 linear feet of perimeter wall in Third Mutual and 3,475 has been fitted with shepherd's crook since the pilot program started in 2017.

The shepherd's crook contract award recommendation for United Mutual is scheduled to be presented at the June 26 Closed Session Maintenance and Construction Committee meeting. There is approximately 21,000 linear feet of perimeter wall in United Mutual, and 1,500 linear feet has been fitted with shepherd's crook since 2018.
