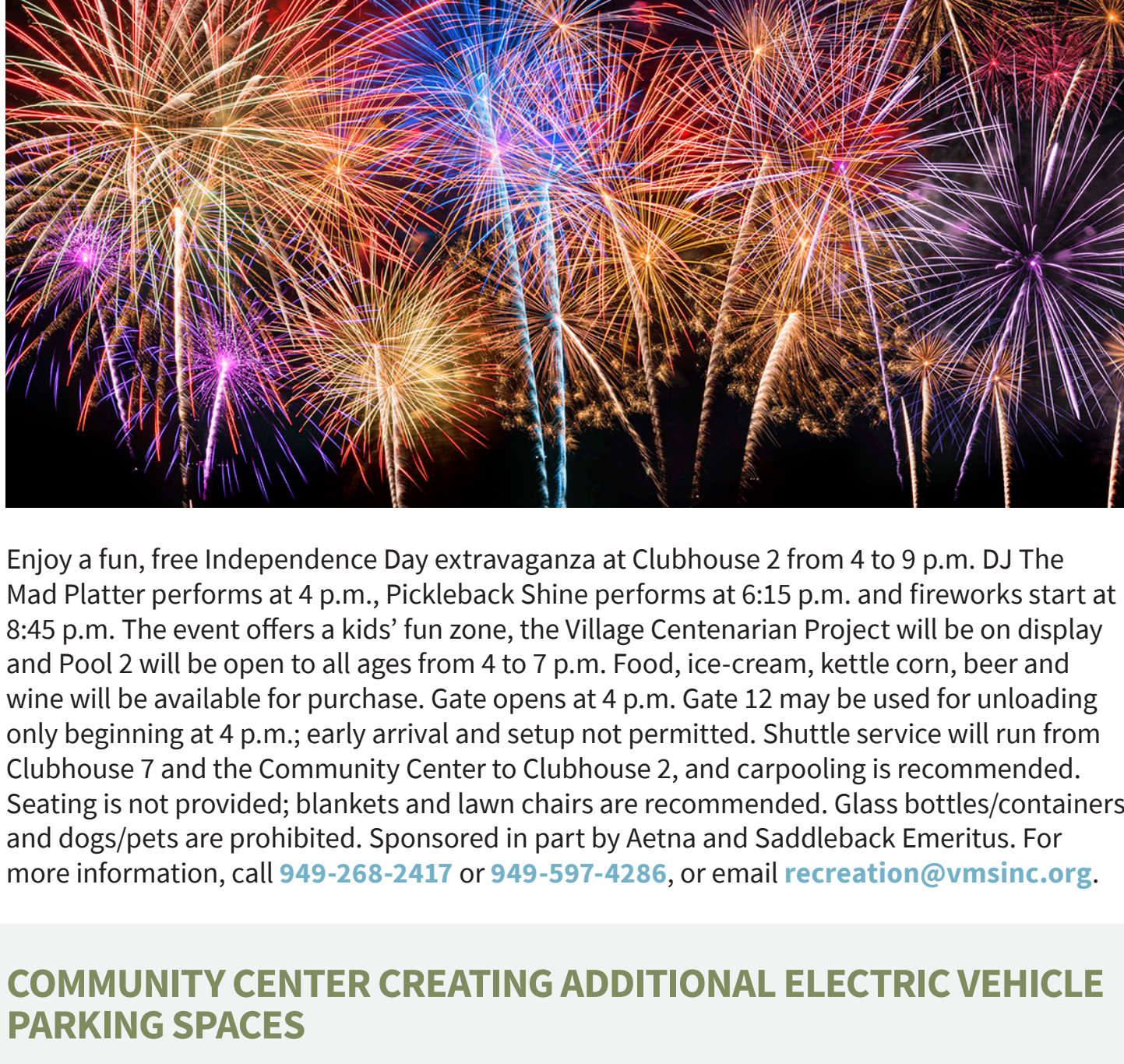
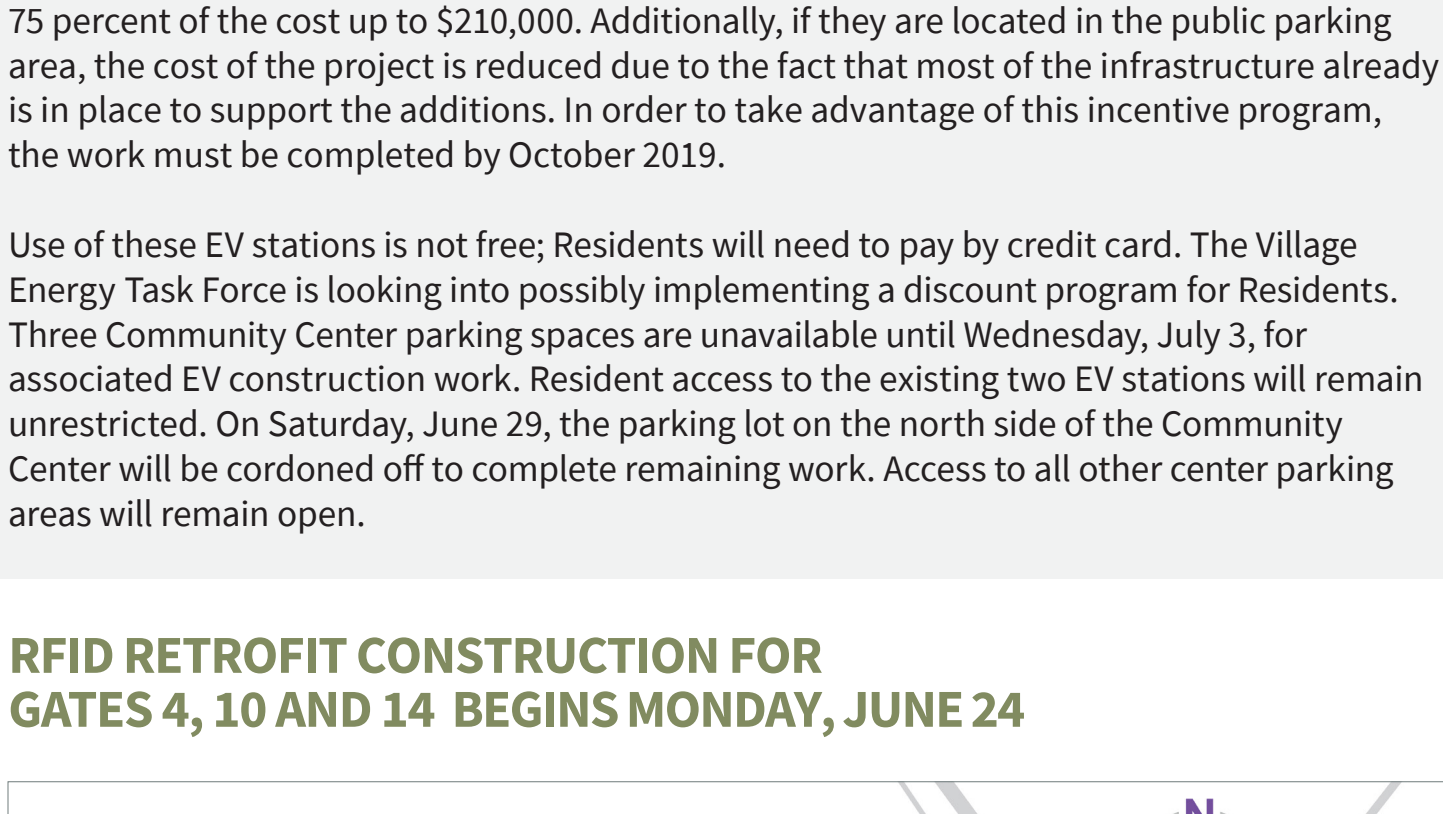


CELEBRATE THE FOURTH OF JULY IN THE VILLAGE!

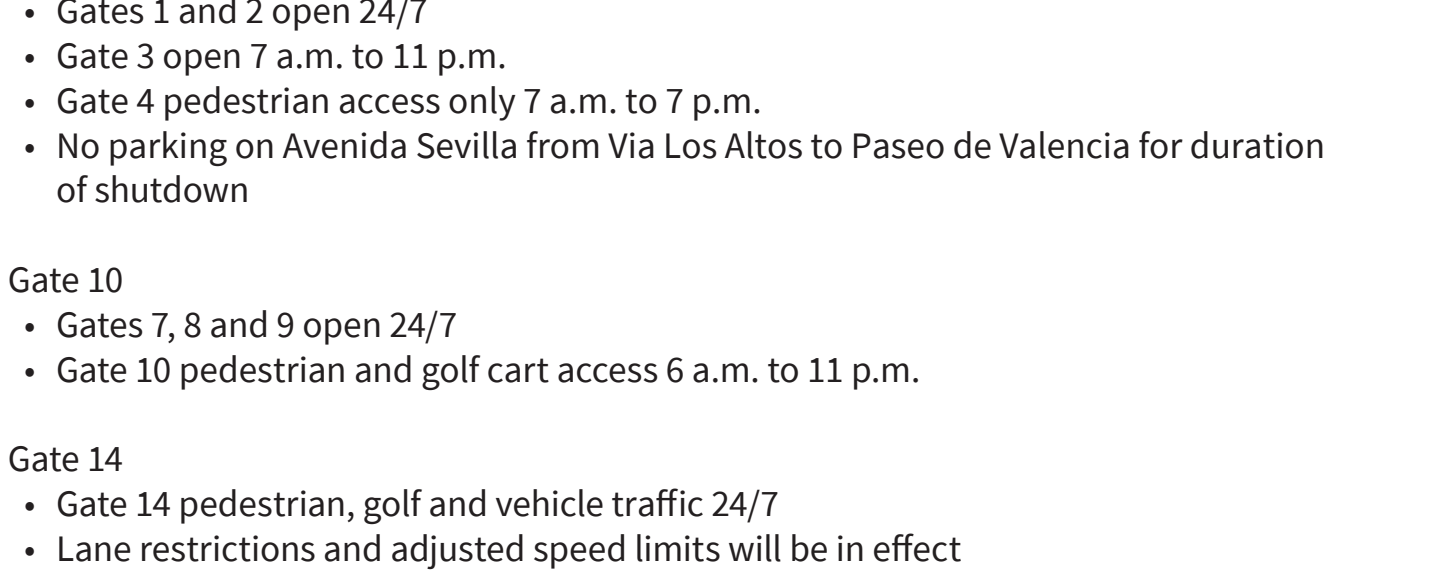
COMMUNITY CENTER CREATING ADDITIONAL ELECTRIC VEHICLE PARKING SPACES



The GRF Board has approved the installation of five new electric vehicle charging (EV) stations in the Community Center parking lot adjacent to the current two EV stations. EV stations established in a public space such as the Community Center qualify the Village to be eligible under the Southern California Incentive Project (SCIP) to be reimbursed up to 75 percent of the cost up to \$210,000. Additionally, if they are located in the public parking area, the cost of the project is reduced due to the fact that most of the infrastructure already is in place to support the additions. In order to take advantage of this incentive program, the work must be completed by October 2019.

Use of these EV stations is not free; Residents will need to pay by credit card. The Village Energy Task Force is looking into possibly implementing a discount program for Residents. Three Community Center parking spaces are unavailable until Wednesday, July 3, for associated EV construction work. Resident access to the existing two EV stations will remain unrestricted. On Saturday, June 29, the parking lot on the north side of the Community Center will be cordoned off to complete remaining work. Access to all other center parking areas will remain open.

RFID RETROFIT CONSTRUCTION FOR GATES 4, 10 AND 14 BEGINS MONDAY, JUNE 24



Radio frequency identification decal (RFID) retrofit construction for Gates 4, 10 and 14 will begin Monday, June 24. The project is expected to take six weeks.

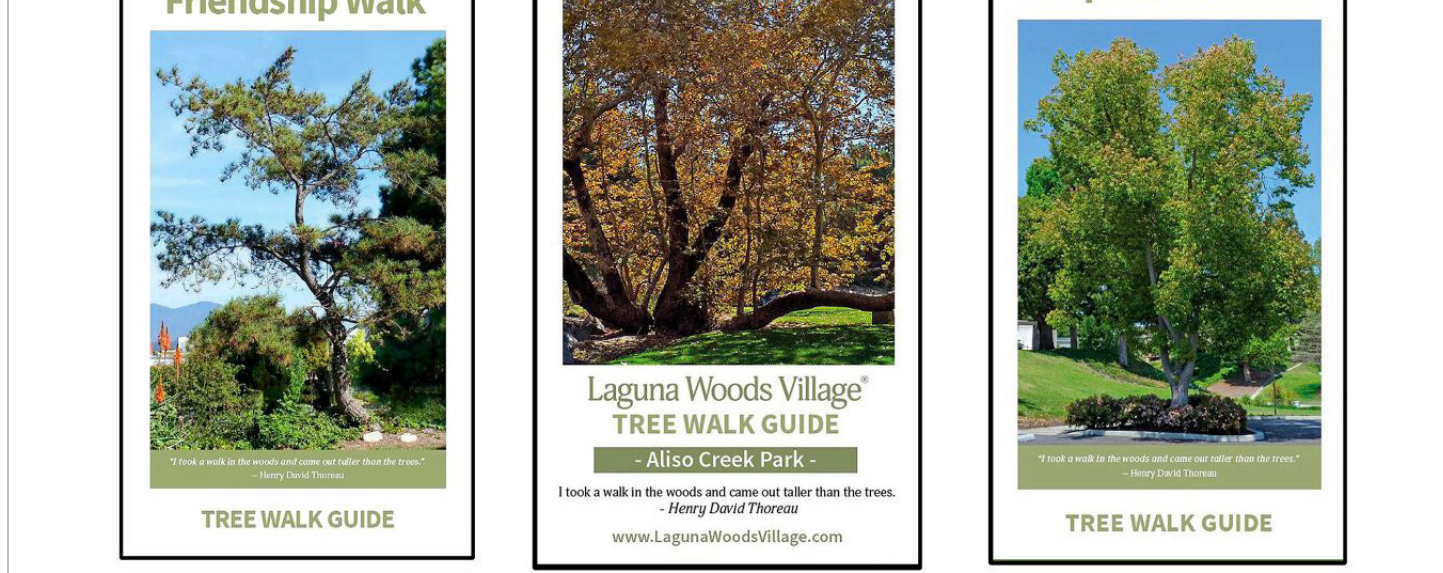
Gates 4, 10 and 14: Alternates and Adjusted Hours

HISTORY CENTER RECEIVES GENEROUS TREE WALK BROCHURE DONATION

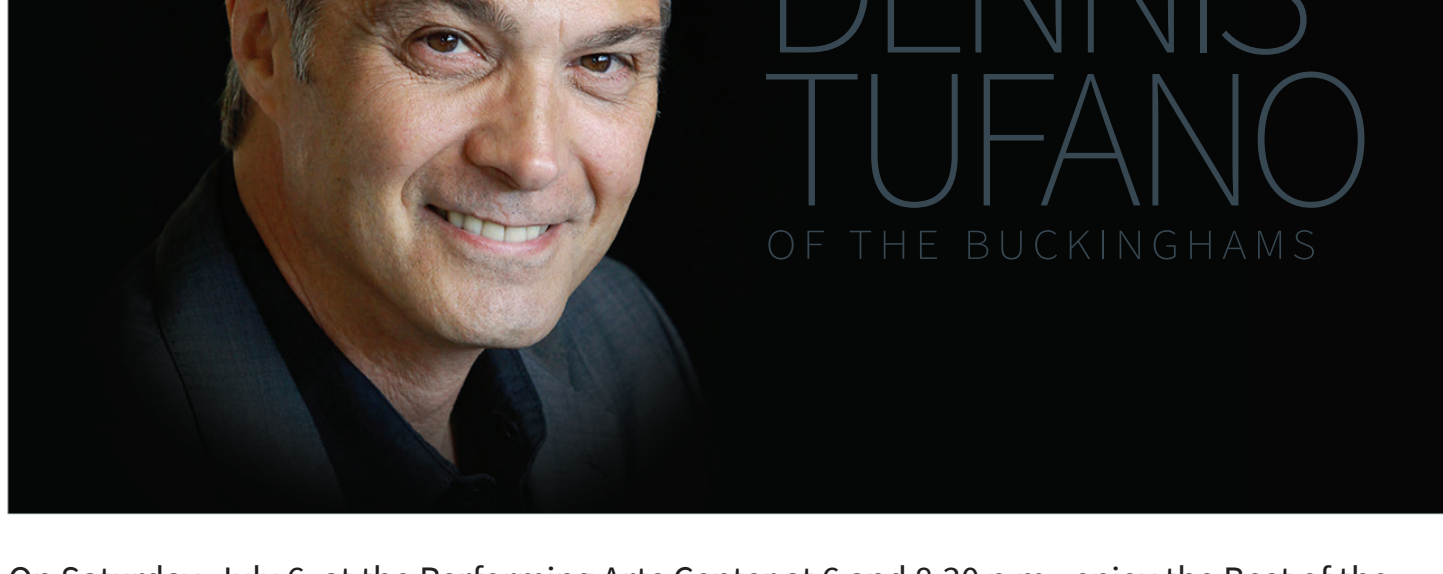


The History Center is excited to announce the donation of 1,000 copies each of three Tree Walk Guides for distribution to Residents at the History Center.

RECEPTION TO CELEBRATE LAUNCH OF VILLAGE CENTENARIAN PROJECT

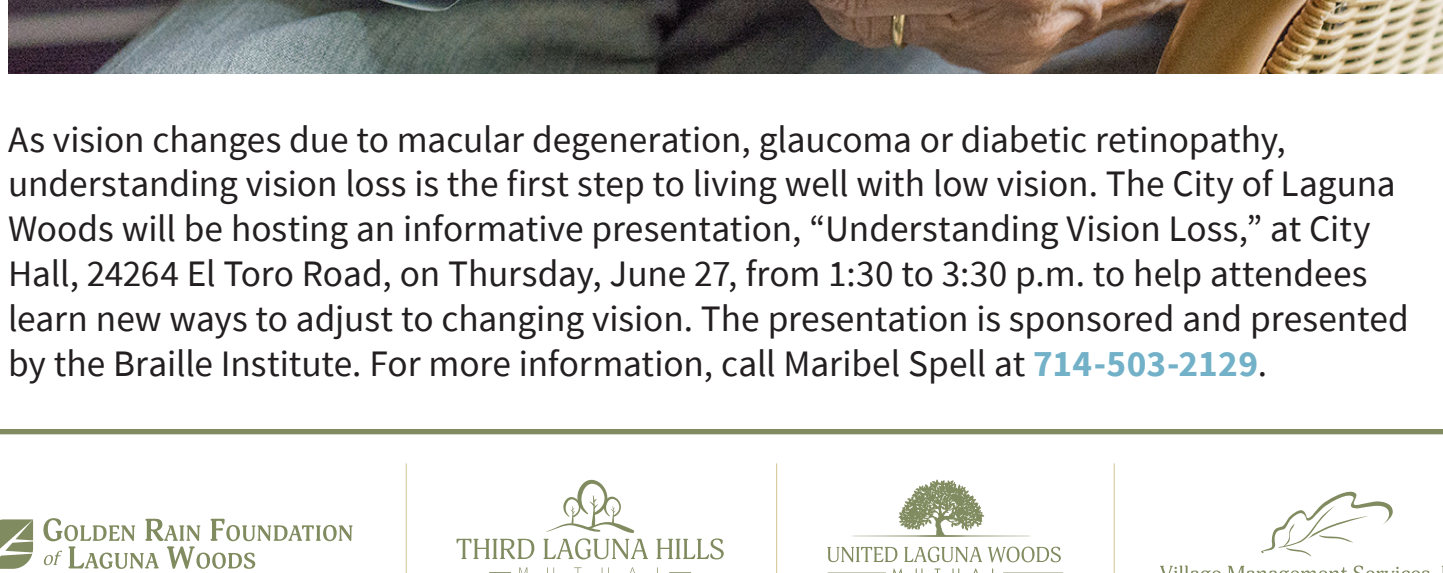


Left: Harriet Mudge in her mid-20s and today. Right: Beatrice Hurwitz at her college graduation and today.

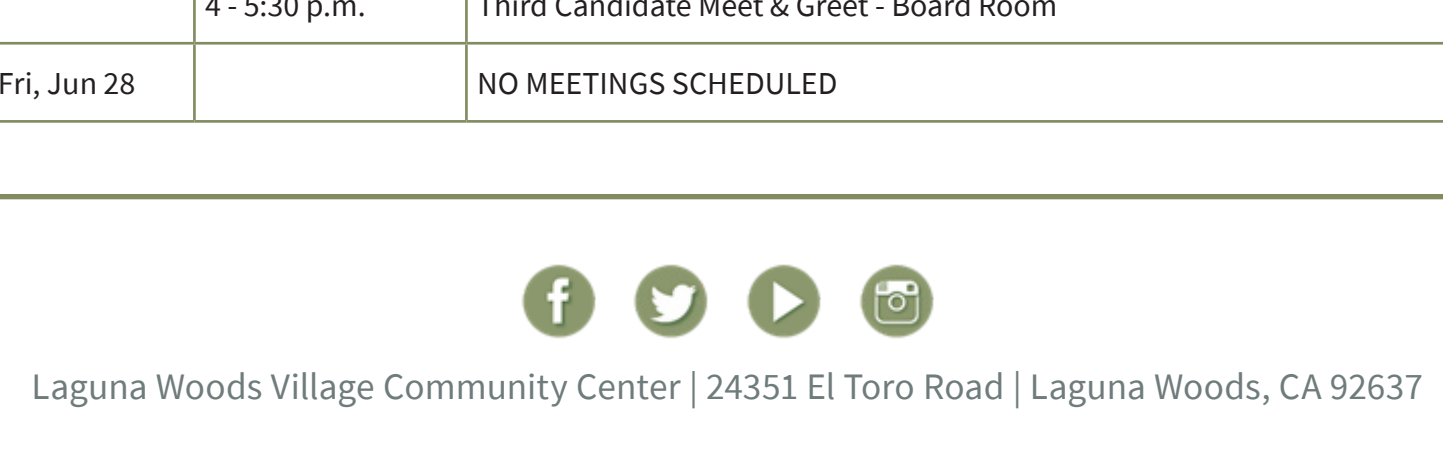
